Invitation to Japan-Denmark Dialogue Forum on Circular Economy and Youth, with the aim of bringing youths voices and their input into multi-stakeholder discussions that aim to develop a future fit circular economy policy framework.

As children inherit the planet we leave behind, it is important that children are equipped with the necessary skillsets to build a sustainable future and policy makers and companies are supportive by enabling opportunities to facilitate their involvement in tackling these challenges.

The aim of the forum is to launch an international knowledge-sharing platform with relevant stakeholders both from Denmark and Japan, including youth, schools, educators, academia, policy makers and companies to facilitate discussion on topics such as:

- What does sustainability, circular economy means for Japanese youth?
- How do we support Japanese youth to be more engaged in circular behaviors?
- How do we bridge this gap to ensure all youths are informed and aware about circular economy issues?
- How can educators be more pro-active in cultivating circular behaviors?"

In the forum, LEGO Group will share their recent global youth study, which surveyed youths ages 8-18 across 7 countries (Canada, US, France, UK, Germany, China and Japan) to understand what their concerns and aspirations for their environment. Furthermore, good practices and examples of on-going projects will be presented by Japanese students/schools and by Tokyo Metropolitan Government.
